

## SUGGESTIONS FOR BREAKING BRICK WALLS

- 1. Start with what you know.
- 2. Document your findings (positive and negative).
- 3. Transcribe everything!
- 4. Evaluate your sources. Don't ignore conflicting information.
- 5. Cite <u>all</u> of your sources.
- 6. Do reverse name searches and look for spelling variations.
- 7. Create a timeline of events.
- 8. Study local and national history.
- 9. Check newspapers.
- 10. Thoroughly research the FAN club.
- 11.Reach out to the local genealogical or historical society where your ancestor lived.
- 12. Ask for help from a fellow family researcher. Another pair of eyes may add clarity.
- 13. Know that not everything is on the internet.
